Synopsis

The composition of the native fish community of Pickerel Lake is not well documented. Brook trout probably occurred and may have been the only major sport fish species native to the lake. Walleye were introduced beginning in 1939. The habitat is well suited to walleye in the form of relatively low water clarity due to large amounts of dissolved carbon originating from the large watershed. Walleye are now the dominant sport fish species in the lake. Assessments in 1988 and 2007 found a healthy walleye population with a good range of sizes and ages represented. Walleye growth is quite slow for smaller fish but they do have the potential to grow to large sizes due to the presence of an abundant population of small cisco. Fishing effort and harvest have never been quantified, but are thought to be moderate, due, in part, to the poorly developed public access.

Pickerel Lake has been randomly chosen as a 'fixed' lake for the provincial Broad-scale Monitoring program. Sampling of a multitude of parameters is planned to contribute to the long term monitoring of walleye lakes in FMZ 15. Detailed results will be reported in FMZ data and interpretive reports at the end of each five year cycle. A sampling bulletin is available.

Several species not previously documented were caught in the lake in 2011. Golden shiner, bluntnose minnow and trout-perch as probably native. The spiny water flea is an invasive zooplankton species that has a major impact on the native zooplankton community.
