#### **Synopsis**

Limited information is available on the fish community in Fawn Lake. Brook trout were probably the primary native sport fish species, but there is no record of how abundant they were historically. Smallmouth bass were stocked as early as 1947; it is curious that they were not listed as being present at the time of the 1963 survey. Regardless, the colonization by bass would have had a severe impact on the brook trout population. Trout still occur occasionally; they probably rely on cold water tributary streams as nursery areas where small trout can avoid predation by bass. Largemouth bass have become established since the 1972 survey, probably as a result of an intentional, but unauthorized introduction. In 2014 an angler reported catching Northern Pike suggesting possible introduction of the species.
